WELCOME TO ST. JOHN’S

Just a friendly reminder.... Worship is sacred time; a time when God comes to us through his Word and Sacraments. In order to maintain reverence during worship we kindly ask that worshipers refrain from “regular conversation” during the service. Please refrain from cell phone use and ensure that ringers on phones are shut off before the service begins. **Please keep all food and beverage (with the exception of bottled water) out of the church/pews.** The “mother’s room” in the back of the church is available for parents with young children, should the need arise. OPENING VERSES

P: We begin our worship in the name of the Father and of the ☩ Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: **Amen.**

P: The Word of God testifies to the presence of the Holy Spirit from beginning to end, from eternity to eternity. As we read in Genesis: “In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth ...

C: **and the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters.”** (Genesis 1:1-2)

P: The prophets told of the promised Savior: “There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse ...

C: **and the Spirit of the Lord shall rest upon him.”** (Isaiah 11:1-2)

P: When the time was fulfilled, the angel said to Mary: “The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you;

C: **therefore the child to be born will be called holy—the Son of God.”** (Luke 1:35)

P: “And when Jesus was baptized, immediately he went up from the water, and behold, the heavens were opened to him,

C: **and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming to rest on him.”** (Matthew 3:16)

P: Jesus said, “These things I have spoken to you while I am still with you.

C: **But the Helper, the Holy Spirit ... he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you.”** (John 14:25-26)

P: “When the day of Pentecost arrived, [the disciples] were all together in one place. And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind ...

C: **and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance.”** (Acts 2:1-4)

P: “No one speaking in the Spirit of God ever says, ‘Jesus is accursed!’

C: **And no one can say ‘Jesus is Lord’ except in the Holy Spirit.”** (1 Corinthians 12:3)

P: “He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches.

C: **To the one who conquers I will grant to eat of the tree of life, which is in the paradise of God.”** (Revelation 2:7)

BRIEF ORDER OF CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

P: Jesus said that the promised Spirit would convict the world of sin and righteousness and judgment. Convicted of our sins, let us confess those sins to God.

C: Almighty God, we confess that we daily turn away from your Word and your will. We follow our sinful desires and listen to the temptations of the world around us. Have mercy on us and forgive us. By your Spirit restore and strengthen us for service in Jesus' name.

P: Almighty God in his mercy has given his Son to die for us and for his sake forgives us all our sins. As a called and ordained servant of the Word, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the ☩ Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

THE PRAYER OF THE DAY

P: The Lord be with you.

C: And also with you.

P: Let us pray: Heavenly Father, on Pentecost you poured out your Spirit on the followers of Jesus. Having received the promised gift of the Spirit, the disciples boldly proclaimed the good news of Jesus, who was crucified for the sins of the world and raised to life on the third day. The Holy Spirit has called us through that same good news, and we pray that you would lead us by your Spirit to be bold witnesses for our Savior so that others will come to know and confess Jesus as Lord. Hear our prayer and accept our praise in Jesus' holy name.

C: Amen.

THE FIRST LESSON

(Acts 2:1-21)

Pg. 1091 (Pew Bible)

2 When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. ² Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. ³ They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. ⁴ All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them. ⁵ Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven. ⁶ When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard their own language being spoken. ⁷ Utterly amazed, they asked: "Aren't all these who are speaking Galileans?" ⁸ Then how is it that each of us hears them in our native language? ⁹ Parthians, Medes and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰ Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene; visitors from Rome ¹¹ (both Jews and converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs—we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!" ¹² Amazed and perplexed, they asked one another, "What does this mean?" ¹³ Some, however, made fun of them and said, "They have had too much wine." ¹⁴ Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd: "Fellow Jews and all of you who live in Jerusalem, let me explain this to you; listen carefully to what I say. ¹⁵ These people are not drunk, as you suppose. It's only nine in the morning! ¹⁶ No, this is what was spoken by the

prophet Joel: ¹⁷““In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visions, your old men will dream dreams. ¹⁸ Even on my servants, both men and women, I will pour out my Spirit in those days, and they will prophesy. ¹⁹ I will show wonders in the heavens above and signs on the earth below, blood and fire and billows of smoke. ²⁰ The sun will be turned to darkness and the moon to blood before the coming of the great and glorious day of the Lord. ²¹ And everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.’

R: This is the Word of the Lord.

C: **Thanks be to God.**

THE SECOND LESSON (Romans 8:22-27) Pg. 1132 (Pew Bible)

²² We know that the whole creation has been groaning as in the pains of childbirth right up to the present time. ²³ Not only so, but we ourselves, who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for our adoption to sonship, the redemption of our bodies. ²⁴ For in this hope we were saved. But hope that is seen is no hope at all. Who hopes for what they already have? ²⁵ But if we hope for what we do not yet have, we wait for it patiently. ²⁶ In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us through wordless groans. ²⁷ And he who searches our hearts knows the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for God’s people in accordance with the will of God.

R: This is the Word of the Lord.

C: **Thanks be to God.**

ALLELUIA VERSE

C: **Alleluia. Lord to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life.
Alleluia, Alleluia.**

THE HOLY GOSPEL (John 15:26-27; 16:4-15) Pg. 1083 (Pew Bible)

C: **Glory to You, O Lord.**

²⁶“When the Advocate comes, whom I will send to you from the Father—the Spirit of truth who goes out from the Father—he will testify about me. ²⁷ And you also must testify, for you have been with me from the beginning. I did not tell you this from the beginning because I was with you, ⁵ but now I am going to him who sent me. None of you asks me, ‘Where are you going?’ ⁶ Rather, you are filled with grief because I have said these things. ⁷ But very truly I tell you, it is for your good that I am going away. Unless I go away, the Advocate will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you. ⁸ When he comes, he will prove the world to be in the wrong about sin and righteousness and judgment: ⁹ about sin, because people do not believe in me; ¹⁰ about righteousness,

because I am going to the Father, where you can see me no longer; ¹¹ and about judgment, because the prince of this world now stands condemned. ¹² “I have much more to say to you, more than you can now bear. ¹³ But when he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all the truth. He will not speak on his own; he will speak only what he hears, and he will tell you what is yet to come. ¹⁴ He will glorify me because it is from me that he will receive what he will make known to you. ¹⁵ All that belongs to the Father is mine. That is why I said the Spirit will receive from me what he will make known to you.”

THE SERVICE OF THE SACRAMENT




