Dear Friends in Jesus,

So what is Lent all about? I suppose it depends on who you are talking to doesn't it?

Historically Lent is a 40 day period of time-(not including Sundays: Sunday's are always feast days celebrating the resurrection) set aside as a time of preparation and contemplation; a time of reflection as we consider what Jesus has done for us on the cross; a time of repentance and renewal in preparation for the celebration of the resurrection of our Lord. Of course, there are various ways that folks might use this time to prepare:

- Regular time of devotion each day
- Regular prayer time each day
- Regular worship (on Sundays & the mid-week Lenten rotations in our circuit.)

And then for the some, the 40 day period of preparation might be a time when they choose to sacrifice or give something up. This is a very popular discipline; especially the practice of giving up meat on Fridays. However, whether you are giving up chocolate, Pepsi, some other sweet, or just sticking to meat on a Friday; the question ought to be, WHY? Are we doing it out of obligation or are we doing it because it helps us see Jesus more clearly?

At the end of the day, Lent is a time to fix our eyes on our Lord's sacrifice on that very cross for our sake. The traditions and practices of Lent should always point us or help us see God's free grace and his forgiveness and favor won only by the death of Christ Jesus.

Tradition is good if it helps us in reflecting on the truth and meaning of Christ crucified. If giving something up is helpful to you and contributes to your spiritual Lenten walk by drawing you closer to Jesus, then it is a useful and good practice. If it's not, then that is OK! (BTW instead of giving up "something that only impacts you" what about giving up-sacrificing a part of your self or routine; your time and talents for the good of someone else— for the good of community.... Just a thought!)

It's all a matter of Christian freedom. It isn't about requirement. It isn't about obligation. It isn't about one being more devout than the other. It's about thinking on our Lord's death in a meaningful way.

May this Lenten season draw you closer to God and help you fix your eyes on the cross that there you might see Jesus more clearly; that there you might see the sacrifice Jesus made for you so that you might freely know love, forgiveness and new life!
